Invasive Aquatic Plant Survey

On July 7th, Terry Demers and I conducted a survey of the North Branch of Buck Lake looking for invasive aquatic plants. We were specifically looking for any of 8 aquatic plants that have been found in or near other Ontario lakes. (More details about these plants can be found in the [May 2015 newsletter](#).) Whenever we saw anything that we thought might be an invasive plant, we took pictures and noted the GPS coordinates. All the data was then submitted into [EDDMapS](#) (Early Detection and Distribution Mapping System). We found several plants that looked to us like it might possibly be water hyacinth. Before any information was stored in the system, experts reviewed the images to verify that we had made a correct assessment. As it turns out, the plants were all pickerel weed. This was very good news, as it is growing in many locations on both branches.

In August, Martha Sheinman and I repeated the process for the South Branch. We noted some of the areas where Eurasian water-milfoil was growing, but that was the only invasive aquatic plant we found. There were some plants that we thought could have been yellow iris, but there were no flowers so we could not tell what the plants were.

We are fortunate that Buck Lake is relatively free of invasive plants, however it will take constant vigilance by all users of the lake to keep it that way. Remember, if you move your boat between lakes, simple steps like pumping out the bilge water and drying and inspecting your boat before putting it back in the water can help keep invasive plants from entering the lake.

Although a survey like this was good for getting an initial picture of the state of the entire lake, it is much more effective if everyone is keeping an eye on their little corner of the lake. If you notice any unfamiliar plants anywhere on the lake, please contact info@bucklake.ca and we will happily investigate it further. If invasive species are detected early, there are resources available in the province that can assist in removing the plants, before they take over the lake.

Some of FOCA's roles include:

- Advocacy to decision-makers, including holding a seat on dozens of government and environmental committees and coalitions.
- Constant vigilance and timely communications about federal, provincial and municipal policy and practice related to Ontario's waterways.
- Galvanizing the large waterfront community with timely calls-to-action that drive regional groups, Associations and individual property owners to speak up on key issues.
- Facilitating ongoing citizen science, especially community-based water monitoring through the Lake Partner Program and new Aquatic Invasive Species Monitoring Program. It is through the FOCA Lake Partner program, that several volunteers from Buck Lake have been measuring water clarity and collecting water samples for phosphorous analysis.
- Community building: providing tools, workshops and programs to foster engagement and support the growth of lake associations (Association Toolkit) and individual owners (Cottage Succession Seminar Series; Insurance discounts)
- Spreading awareness about sustainable waterfront living and best-practices to all!

Some more specific actions include pushing off property tax reassessments for three years; a move FOCA calculates saved waterfront property taxpayers in Ontario \$100-million. In 2012, FOCA pushed for Hydro rate reductions of \$2-million. Also, FOCA's insurance program has saved waterfront associations at least a half million dollars in premiums while offering excellent liability coverage that is second to none.


Lemonade Stand Raises Money for Local Family
